Morning Session:

Analytic Reading in an Age of Change

Analytic reading (AR) is an approach to reading instruction that is closely linked to executive function and is based on a definition of reading as a cognitive process in which the reader actively constructs meaning through the interaction between background knowledge and the text. From this foundation, students learn the steps of AR.



The instructional method offers guidance on how to recognize the common text organizational patterns writers use and leads students to focus not only on the what of the content, but also how the writer expresses intended meaning. The AR approach is appropriate for students at all levels.

Ann P. Kaganoff, PhD, BCET, FAET, has been in education for six decades, from pre-school to grad school. She was on the faculty of the University of California and has been an Educational Therapist in Irvine, California for 28 years. She has led workshops and trainings in all literacy areas and specializes in using the Case Study as a teaching tool for educational therapists. She is a Past President of AET, and was Chair of the Certification Board. She is the author of a new book, Best Practices in Educational Therapy (Routledge, forthcoming in 2019).

Afternoon Session:

Lessons Learned from the Reading Brain: What Neuroscience Can Really Tell Us About Reading Development and Disorders

For over 20 years, neuroimaging tools such as the MRI have allowed us to peer inside the human brain as it develops and executes the processes needed for reading. Can we use brain imaging to make practical decisions regarding accurate diagnosis and intervention? This session will discuss important insights, and what they can tell us about optimal reading instruction for each student.

Elizabeth Norton, PhD, is an Assistant Professor at Northwestern University, where she leads the Language, Education and Reading Neuroscience (LEARN) Lab. Her research combines behavioral and brain measures to understand typical development as well as neurodevelopmental disorders. She focuses on understanding individual differences and early identification and intervention for reading disabilities.
